# AUSTIN DISASTER RELIEF NETWORK AIDS LOUISIANA FLOOD SURVIVORS VOLUNTEERS, FUNDS NEEDED

Austin, TX – Austin Disaster Relief Network (ADRN), a network of more than 170 greater Austin churches, arrived with a team of more than 40 volunteers in Denham Springs, Louisiana, late Friday, August 19, 2016. Since Saturday, Austin volunteers have begun distributing more than 28 pallets of fans, clean up kits, toiletries, toys, disaster supplies, food and other items donated by the Austin community.

Elderly and disabled survivors and small children found respite from the 95-degree heat in ADRN's new air-conditioned mobile disaster tent, recently purchased with a grant from the WalMart Foundation. Survivors waited patiently up to three hours in long lines, as thousands of survivors came to the Healing Place Church to receive disaster supplies and personal items.

ADRN anticipates reaching more than 2,000 families in Denham Springs over the next 7-10 days, providing crisis intervention, spiritual support, gift cards and connecting families with critical resources that will help them rebuild their homes and their lives over the coming months. ADRN's Crisis Team visited nearly 200 homes on their first day of deployment. The majority of the area sustained approximately seven to eight feet of water, devastating many homes.

"ADRN is humbled to represent the greater Austin churches and our city to meet the needs of so many families in need," said Daniel Geraci, Executive Director of the Austin Disaster Relief Network. "Since I arrived this last week, I've been incredibly inspired by the strength and resilient spirit of the people of Denham Springs. I'm confident that the people of Austin can come together to help meet their great needs, from clean up to food and toiletries to undergarments to comfort items."
