PFLUGERVILLE MAYOR, POLICE CHIEF MEET AUSTIN MAYOR ADLER AT ADRN

Austin, TX – **Pflugerville Mayor Victor Gonzales and Police Chief Jessica Robledo will join Austin Mayor Steve Adler to deliver items collected for Hurricane Harvey relief.**

The presentation will be made on **Wednesday, September 6, at 3:00 p.m. at the Austin Disaster Relief Network Headquarters, 1122 E. 51st Street, Austin Tx 78723.**

The Pflugerville Police Department in conjunction with community-wide support and Law Enforcement Association of Pflugerville (LEAP) initiated a collection drive at the Pflugerville Justice Center collect items for Hurricane Harvey relief. Mayor Gonzales and Chief Robledo will present the supplies to Mayor Steve Adler, who called for the donations last week.

"Pflugerville collectively lent support to aid our fellow Texans affected by the storm," Mayor Gonzales said. "These donations are but a small extension of the expression of caring and community spirit embodied in Pflugerville and our concern for others. I'm proud that in just one weekend that we were able to fill an entire truck with needed supplies," he said.
