AUSTIN DISASTER RELIEF NETWORK PREPARES TEAMS TO RESPOND TO SAN MARCOS APARTMENT FIRES

Austin, TX – Austin Disaster Relief Network (ADRN) is preparing to mobilize Emotional and Spiritual Care response teams to offer aid to survivors impacted by this morning's apartment fire that occurred in San Marcos at the Iconic Village 222 Ramsay St, San Marcos, TX 78666. ADRN teams will provide emotional and spiritual care, immediate financial assistance, clothing and supplies, and long-term recovery support. Timing and details of mobilization will be determined after further collaboration with local government and agencies.

Local congregations from ADRN's network of more than 175 churches are also preparing to sponsor survivor families through ADRN's Disaster Relief Shepherd program to guide them through the recovery process.

ADRN is coordinating closely with Hays County, Red Cross and BR3T.
