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## HOW FUNDS WILL BE DEPLOYED IN THE COMING DAYS AND WEEKS

### Volunteer Deployment & Coordination

Logistics, staff, fuel, and supplies for volunteers serving in muck-out, debris removal, and cleanup operations

### Crisis Call Center & Case Intake

Technology, training, and staff oversight to operate a remote call center to intake and triage the needs of survivors

### Survivor Support & Emergency Needs

Gift cards, emergency housing assistance, hygiene kits, and other critical items for families displaced or severely affected.

### Longer-Term Recovery

Case management, spiritual and emotional care, and survivor resource navigation over the next 30-90 days



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
